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### Guided Reading Centers

Teachers can create literacy centers that support guided reading instruction. As the teacher works with one group of students for guided reading, other groups rotate through the literacy centers in the classroom. Literacy centers can be created by simply setting out literacy activities on a table or they can be located in designated classroom areas.

My "Literacy Centers That Work" model is structured around 6-7 work centers that students visit while the teacher meets with guided reading or other literacy small groups. Reading, writing, speaking, and listening are the foundations of the centers activities in this framework. Think of it as an ice cream sundae.

### Literacy Centers That Work - Learning at the Primary Pond

The answer: Literacy Centers! For each new literacy unit, I prepare 5 centers that all students rotate through over a period of 2 days. I generally allow 20 minutes for each center. The 6th center, is guided reading so every student gets guided reading time every other day. Hooray!

### How To: Guided Reading Centers and Management

It is extremely important to model and teach each center explicitly before letting students do them on their own. Following a gradual release of responsibility model will make them more successful at completing their centers independently, which means you get to teach in guided reading! When teaching each center, you should model model model!

### How to Create Smart Literacy Centers that Last All Year ...

We have Guided Reading/Centers Monday-Thursday from about 1:10-2:00 and I rotate through four groups. This means each center is 12 minutes long, with about 30 seconds for a transition. 12 minutes can fly by, so the students have to work on getting those transitions DOWN.

I typically only have four centers going, guided reading included. I have about five reading groups in my room so I usually have two groups doing independent reading at a time. I do make sure that every student goes to independent reading once a day, and then alternates the other centers.
