What causes lumbar radiculopathy? You may get a pinched nerve in your lumbar spine if you have disc damage. Discs are natural, spongy cushions between your vertebrae (back bones) that allow your spine to move. Your discs may move out of place and pinch the nerve in your spine. Your risk for a pinched nerve and lumbar radiculopathy increases if: You smoke.

### Lumbar Radiculopathy - What You Need to Know

Radiculopathy can be caused by any disease or injury process that compresses or otherwise injures the spinal nerve root from trauma or falls, cancer, infections, diseases that lead to degeneration of the vertebrae and/or intervertebral discs (osteoarthritis), slipped or herniated discs, spine deformities (scoliosis), and other factors as well.

The most common cause of lumbar radiculopathy is a herniated disk, which tends to follow a predictable onset and pattern. However, there are several other diagnoses that may cause lumbar radiculopathy-type symptoms and are therefore mimickers of lumbar radiculopathy. These mimickers each have a different onset and pattern of symptoms.

Herniated discs and spinal stenosis are the most common causes of radiculopathy. Typically, these are both the result of wear and tear—or degeneration—of the spine. Other causes include bone spurs and spinal injury. People at risk of developing radiculopathy include those with degenerative joint diseases, which increases with age.

Radiculopathy is typically caused by changes in the tissues surrounding the nerve roots. These tissues include bones of the spinal vertebrae, tendons and intervertebral discs. When these tissues shift or change in size, they may narrow the spaces where the nerve roots travel inside the spine or exit the spine; these openings are called foramina.

Lumbar radiculopathy is the nerve irritation caused due to damage to the discs between the vertebrae. Lumbar radiculopathy is more commonly known as sciatica. The term Sciatica refers to symptoms of pain, numbness and tingling which arise from nerve root compression or irritation in the lumbosacral spine and are felt in its distribution.

Radiculopathy is caused by impingement of a spinal nerve root. The most common cause of compression is a disc herniation and/or degenerative changes in the spine. Spondylolisthesis (when a vertebra is out of alignment relative to the adjacent vertebra) may also contribute.

Myofascial pain – hip muscles can mimic pain from lumbar radiculopathy; shoulder girdle muscles can produce pain radiating into the upper extremity. Examine for tenderness at specific muscle sites which when palpated produce radiating pain
