The Ruy Lopez is named after 16th-century Spanish priest Ruy López de Segura. It is one of the most popular openings, with such a vast number of variations that all codes from C60 to C99 in the ...

He made a systematic study of this and other chess openings, which he recorded in a 150 page book.

In the Ruy Lopez (shown below), I could play e4 first while black plays nc6 on their first move. As long as the position ends up with the Bishop coming to the b5 square and attacking the knight on c6, it will be considered the Ruy Lopez, but could be a variation of it.

Best Chess Openings for White & Black (42 Openings)

For example, playing 1. e4 nc6 can turn into a regular Italian game, but it is by black's choice. If black instead plays e5 right away, then white can turn the opening into other things. The move Nc6 is less committal than pushing a pawn, which is a concrete move.
